#### **General information**

# 5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

#### 5.3. Advice for firefighters

In case of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Move undamaged containers from immediate hazard area if it can be done safely. In case of fire: Wear self-contained breathing apparatus.
